Exhibitor or owner MUST sign on the signature line beneath the instructions.

1. This area needs to have the name of the club and the dates of the show that you are entering.
2. Enter the amount of entry fees that are enclosed.
3. Circle which height you are competing at and the classes that you are entering. Refer to AKC for jump height information.

You can enter in Regular Standard, JWW, FAST and T2B or Preferred Standard, JWW, FAST and T2B. You cannot enter regular classes and preferred classes on the same day or on the same weekend. Any dog may enter the Preferred Classes.

REGULAR CLASSES (Novice A, Novice B, Open, Excellent A, Excellent B)

These classes are Standard, JWW and FAST as defined by the AKC. If entering Regular Novice A or B classes, be sure to enter the correct class.

Novice A is for dogs that have never acquired any AKC agility title. Additionally, a dog entered in Novice A must be handled by a person that has never put an AKC title on any dog, and the handler must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of the owner's household. Handlers that co-own a dog and have never put an AKC agility title on a dog may enter the Novice A class regardless of the other co-owner's AKC agility accomplishments. Dogs eligible for Novice A may be entered in the Novice B class at the discretion of the owner.

Novice B is for dogs that have acquired the Novice Agility Standard title, the Novice JWW title, the Novice FAST title or any Preferred titles; the persons who have handled a dog to any AKC agility title,; and for dogs being handled by someone other than the owner, co-owner, or household member subject to the restriction above.

PREFERRED CLASSES (Novice P, Open P, Excellent AP, Excellent BP):

Preferred classes are offered in Standard, JWW and FAST. These classes are for those who for whatever reasons, might wish to jump at a 4" lower height than your Regular class height and have 5 extra seconds to complete the course. The 5 seconds is added to the time for the Regular jump height. If you jump 16" in a Regular class and 12" in a Preferred class, the extra 5 seconds is added to the time for the Regular 16" dogs, not the 12" dogs. Any dog can be entered in the Preferred classes. Older dogs, novice handlers, novice dogs, dogs coming back from an injury, and people/dogs needing more time and lower heights all benefit from this class. Novice P: There are no Novice A or Novice B classes in the Preferred Standard, JWW and FAST. There is only one class Novice P for all Preferred Novice dogs. It does not matter who handles the dog.

4. Dog Needs to be Measured. Your dog needs to be measured if:

- Your dog has never been measured before
- Your dog has only been measured at a show by a judge who is not a VMO judge (Volunteer Measuring Official). If a VMO judge has measured your dog, you will have received a yellow paper with your dog's measurement on it that can be used as a temporary height card until your dog is 2 years old.
- Your dog is over 2 years old and you have not been measured since then by a VMO judge or AKC rep.
- Your dog is over 2 years old and you only have one measurement by a VMO judge or an AKC rep. This means you will only have 1 yellow measurement paper since your dog turned two.
- Your dog is over 2 years old and your dog has been measured 2 times by different VMP judges or AKC reps and each measurement puts you into a different jump height. You will need a third official measurement to determine your jump height.

You do NOT need to be measured if

- Your dog is under 2 years old and has been measured once by a VMO judge or AKC rep. You will have one yellow measuring slip.
- Your dog is over 2 years old and you have 2 measurements by 2 different VMO judges or AKC reps that put your dog into the same jump height even though you have not yet received your permanent height card from the AKC. You will have 2 yellow papers.
- You have received a permanent height card from the AKC.

More measuring information:

- If your dog needs to be measured, he needs to be measured before you run. Otherwise you would lose your qualifying leg. You should have your jump card or yellow papers with you in case a judge or AKC rep asks you for it.
- For dogs between 15 months and 2 years of age, only one measurement is required by a VMO judge or AKC rep. The handler will retain the yellow measurement form. This form is the dog's temporary jump height card. The AKC does not issue a card

AGREEMENT

I certify that I am the actual owner of the dog, or that I am the duly authorized agent of the actual owner whose name I have entered. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry, I (we) agree to abide by the rules and regulations of The American Kennel Club in effect at the time of this event, and any additional rules and regulations appearing in the premium list of this event and entry form and any decision made in accord with them. I (we) agree that the club holding this event has the right to refuse this entry for cause which the club shall deem sufficient. I (we) certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss, injury or damage to this dog. Additionally, I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify, defend and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties for damage because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this event, however such, injuries, death or property damage may be caused, and whether or not the same may have been caused or may be alleged to have been caused by the negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees, agents, or any other person. I (we) agree that the determination of whether the injury is serious shall be made by the event veterinarian and is binding on me (us).

I (WE) AGREE THAT ANY CAUSE OF ACTION, CONTROVERSY OR CLAIM ARISING OUT OF OR RELATED TO THE ENTRY, EXHIBITION OR ATTENDANCE AT THE EVENT BETWEEN THE AKC AND THE EVENT-GIVING CLUB (UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED IN THIS PREMIUM LIST) AND MYSELF (OURSELVES) OR AS TO THE CONSTRUCTION, INTERPRETATION AND EFFECT OF THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE SETTLED BY ARBITRATION PURSUANT TO THE APPLICABLE RULES OF THE AMERICAN ARBITRATION ASSOCIATION. HOWEVER, PRIOR TO ARBITRATION ALL APPLICABLE AKC BYLAWS, RULES, REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES MUST FIRST BE FOLLOWED AS SET FORTH IN THE AKC CHARTER AND BYLAWS, RULES, REGULATIONS, PUBLISHED POLICIES AND GUIDELINES.

INSTRUCTIONS

Handlers may opt to enter in a higher **height division** for all **Regular** titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs entered in the **Preferred** classes **must** compete at the required jump height and **may not** compete in a jump height division **higher or lower** than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an **Agility Jump Height Card** may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or *back-to-back trials* only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the **AKC Canine PartnersSM** program may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner? _____

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- before a dog is 2 years old. This temporary jump height card form expires on the dog's 2nd birthday
 - After 2 years of age 2 measurements that measure the dog into the same jump height are required by 2 different VMO judges or AKC reps. Occasionally these 2 measurements put the dog in 2 different jump heights; in this case, a third measurement will be used to determine the dog's official jump height. A dog that needs a third measurement should be entered in the jump height from the last measurement he received until he gets his third measurement. The handler keeps all yellow forms as proof of his dog's jump height until the permanent height card is received from AKC.
 - A trial may not have a VMO judge or AKC rep present. If there is not a VMO judge or AKC rep, dogs that are over 2 years old and have not had a measurement since turning 2 or are under 2 years old and have not been measured, must be measured by the judge judging the trial. The measurement will only be effective for that set of trials excluding dogs that jump at the 24" or 26" height. 24" and 26" dogs do not need to be measured by a VMP judge or AKC rep.
5. Enter the sex of the dog (Male/Dog or Female/Bitch)
 6. Height at Withers: A dog's withers are at the base of his neck over his shoulders. If your dog hasn't been measured, stand your dog with his side along a wall, use something flat like a ruler and put it across the dog's withers so the end touches the wall. Mark the wall and measure the height. This will give you an approximate height. When you get to the show you will be measured for his correct height. When in doubt, enter the lower height. If the dog measures taller, you can be moved up in height during the show.
 7. Enter the AKC recognized breed.
 8. If the breed has varieties, enter that here.
 - a. Cocker Spaniels (Black, ASCOB, or Parti Color)
 - b. Beagles (13" or 15")
 - c. Dachshunds (Longhaired, Smooth, or Wirehaired)
 - d. Collies (Rough or Smooth)
 - e. Bull Terriers (Colored or White)
 - f. Manchester Terriers (Standard or Toy)
 - g. Chihuahuas (Smooth coat or long coat)
 - h. English Toy Spaniels (KL & Ruby or Blenheim & PC)
 - i. Poodles (Standard, Miniature or Toy)
 9. The name you call your dog
 10. Enter the full AKC name of the dog. Include AKC titles ONLY.
 11. Check the appropriate box and enter the registration number. If the dog has a foreign registry, note the country or registration. Check the rules for entry of foreign dogs.
 12. Date of birth is entered here.

The AKC requires these 5 items are done correctly. If not, it is an invalid entry and will be returned to you:

1. **Sign your entry!**
2. **Keep the agreement attached to the entry. Do not cut/rip the page in half!**
3. **Fill in every space on the entry.**
4. **Entry must be received after the opening date but before the closing date/time.**
5. **Send a check in the correct amount and make the check out to the correct person.**
